
We want to extend a heartfelt thank you to each and every one of you. Your hard work does not go unnoticed, and we truly couldn't do this without you.

Here's to a year full of growth, success, and shared accomplishments!












A special welcome to Jahquan Taylor. He has already been making a big impact by supporting so many students and staying actively involved in his new school. We're excited to have him on the Henninger team!
